As my heart filled with sorrow over the death of my friend, I thanked God for the opportunity to have shared the Gospel with him so close to the end of his life. I know we can't pray for the dead but I couldn't bear the thought of my friend having entered eternity without Jesus and so was praying that perhaps somehow, in his last moments, he had called out to Jesus and was now in glory with Him. I'm sure there will be many surprises in Heaven and I hope my college friend is one of them.

What this whole experience really showed me however, is that none of us have any idea what time we have on this Earth. It highlighted to me the importance of being ready and willing as a Christian, to share the Gospel at any given moment. We really must redeem the time and be about our Father's business as people's souls depend upon it!

It also showed me that for the non-believer, it's imperative that they ask important questions about eternity now and know where they stand with Jesus before it's too late. For both the believer and the non-believer, it's vital that we seize the day. It was these thoughts that inspired me to write my poem also called, "Seize The Day" and I pray it can be used to encourage people everywhere to talk about Jesus while we still have time.
